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Cellphones & Crosswalks

We all love our smart phones but let's face it, they can be downright dangerous.

Since the year 2000, cellphone use has increased more than eight-fold. This increased use has unfortunately been accompanied by a dramatic increase in pedestrian injuries due to cell phone-related distracted walking.

I witnessed for myself at a busy crosswalk in Broadmoor Village so many adults and kids using their cellphones as they walked to school. It was chaotic as people paid little attention to their surroundings as they stared down at their phones.

I was with Stanley Roberts of "People Behaving Badly" who was taping a segment about cellphones in crosswalks. In fact, he first highlighted this growing problem in 2009.

According to a 2015 report by the National Safety Council (NSC), "distracted walking incidents involving cell phones accounted for more than 11,100 injuries between 2000 and 2011."

The NSC notes that it is "just as important to walk cell free as it is to drive cell free," because "pedestrians and drivers using cell phones are both impaired and too mentally distracted to fully focus on their surroundings."

Indeed, both the National Safety Council and the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration recommend to "never use a cell phone or other electronic device while walking."

Here in California, as elsewhere, there is an important need for such legislation.

While traffic safety can often be a local concern that might be addressed on a street-by-street basis, the state Legislature has generally indicated that issues of traffic safety should be regulated statewide.

But, as the statistics show, the safety of pedestrians continues to be compromised by use of mobile electronic

devices while crossing the street.

That being said, the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors passed a resolution that I sponsored to urge the state Legislature to take action to promote traffic safety by prohibiting use of cell phones while crossing streets or, alternatively, giving express authority to local jurisdictions to regulate the issue.

Laundry Room Courtesy

Have you planned to do your laundry only to find all the washers are in use; or worse yet, all of the washers and dryers full, stopped and no one has either changed machines or picked up their finished laundry. How about dryers left with lint still in their lint screens or soap powder spilled over the machines or all over the floors!

It is important to remember to use less detergent. The high efficiency machines require only half the detergent to accomplish a quality wash. Remember to use only ½ of the amount of detergent you used in the former washers. Too much soap may prevent proper rinsing of your clothes and leave a soapy film on them.

Do not overload your machine. Only load clothes to the top of the agitator, do not "stuff" the clothes into the machine. Overloading can cause machine failure and you'll be left dealing with a wet, soapy mess.

Another good idea, is to set your kitchen timer for the amount of time your laundry will take. When the timer rings you will know your laundry is either ready for the dryer or it is finished. Washers run about 30 minutes. Dryers run 45 minutes or more.

When you are done with any machine, take a couple of minutes to make sure you have removed all your items. Items left in any machine will get mixed up with someone else's clothes and you may never see them again.

Please remember to clean the dryer's lint screen and toss any lint or fabric softener sheets away. Also, put any empty bleach or fabric softener bottles and empty detergent containers in the trash can.

August Board Highlights

Financial Report Ending July 31, 2017: Bautista & Co. reflected a surplus for the month of \$9,483, an ending cash balance of \$1,802,471 and total investments of \$1,607,227 which is designated to reserves.

Coyote Sighting

Dogs - 1

Both the Association Office and Security have received many calls throughout the month about dogs barking in the buildings. This happens during the day and evening hours. Most of the time, the resident is not home. It is each owner's responsibility to take care of their dogs and to make sure their pet does not create a disturbance that annoys the neighbors. Excessive barking is such a disturbance. It is also a violation of the noise rule and owners can, and have been, brought before the Board of Directors where fines can, and have been, levied. If anyone hears excessive barking, please call security at the front gate so they can determine what unit the dog is in.

Certain dog owners are allowing their dogs to defecate on the carpets in the hallways and then expecting someone else to pick up their dog's mess. This is not only unacceptable behavior on the dog owner's part, it also creates a health issue.

Dog owners need to be responsible and take their dog(s) outside to relieve themselves and then pick up the mess and dispose of it appropriately at one of the several doggie stations located throughout the property.
